

Watercolor Art Exhibition at NOHO M55 Gallery opens on June 4

A new exhibition by Emily Stedman opens June 4th at NOHO M55 Gallery in New York City. The exhibition features 40 watercolor paintings and sketchbooks and will be on display until June 22.

In the exhibition 'Suspended In Time', Emily Stedman paints colorful watercolors which tell the story of her surroundings, places she has traveled and where she lives.

Arranged by themes, the exhibit also contains a long shelf on one of the gallery's walls, on which are placed several sketchbooks. The viewer is invited to peruse the sketchbooks which contain on-location artworks and capture what is seen from direct observation.

Stedman is an artist based in New York City. Her family moved to France when she was in first grade. Her oil and watercolor paintings have been shown in group and solo shows including The Brooklyn Museum; Historic Northampton Museum, Northampton, MA; Rotunda Gallery, Brookyn, NY and numerous other galleries, publications and collections. She was Painter-in-Residence at Bryant Park in the summer of 2016 and created a street art mural for the City of Yonkers. Currently she is a Lower Manhattan Cultural Council SU-CASA Artist-In-Residence at Hamilton Grange Senior Center in New York City.

Stedman received a B.F.A from Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington and an M.F.A. from Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, NY where her painting teacher was Jacob Lawrence.
